COURSE DESCRIPTION FIRST GRADE LANGUAGE ARTS

PHILOSOPHY STATEMENT: Language is recognized as a God given gift. Teaching reading, writing, grammar, spelling, and vocabulary empowers students to communicate effectively with others and with God. Students will have the ability and opportunity to express themselves creatively, preparing them for future endeavors.

OBJECTIVE: Students will clearly and correctly express themselves in spoken and in written English. They will learn to understand and correctly use beginning punctuation. They will apply grammar concepts to their own writing.

TIME ALLOTMENT: 75 minutes per day, 5 days a week –Phonics, Spelling, Grammar and writing Reading units, Daily 5, Small Group Instruction

COURSE CONTENT: Develop phonic skills to read, word analysis skills, build vocabulary, and increase reading comprehension. Through guided reading, self-selected reading; the students will strive to become independent, fluent readers who possess an appreciation for various forms of literature. Students will review and maintain manuscript skills and learn how to correctly form both uppercase and lowercase letters in legible form.

COURSE DESCRIPTION FIRST GRADE SCIENCE, HEALTH & SOCIAL STUDIES

PHILOSOPHY STATEMENT: Biblical science is the study of God's creation. God has revealed Himself in two ways: through the Bible and through creation. In creation, God's eternal power and divine nature are clearly perceived, and God has mandated that we investigate, explore, appreciate, and care for God's creation. In this way, we come to understand our Creator better in the process. Social Studies reveal God's sovereign plan through humanity's interaction with nature, social institutions, and community. It is through the understanding of these interactions that students evaluate the patterns of the past in order to work to fulfill God's Kingdom here on Earth.

OBJECTIVE: In science, the students will learn about the world that God created. They will learn how the world is changing, and how living things have a life cycle. They will learn how to care for the creation that has been given to them. In health, which is embedded in the science curriculum, students will learn how to take care of the bodies God gave to them and begin to develop good health and safety habits. In social studies, the students will learn how people live today compared with how they lived in the past, as well as how people live in different parts of the world. They will also learn citizenship, important American symbols and traditions, and basic economic concepts.

COURSE DESCRIPTION GRADES K-5th ELEMENTARY SPANISH
