Wear a silly hat (or your favorite hat!)






Tuesday (3/5)- "Fox in Socks"






Read Across America Day 2024!

Safety:

- ~Arrival: Students should not be dropped of until 8:40am (no staff are available until doors open at 8:40am).
- Our "Kiss and Go" policy (for morning drop offs) Students need to exit the RIGHT SIDE ONLY of the car, for safety.
- ~**Visitors:** Our office team does a pre-screening to ensure we have adequate information on our visitors and the nature of their visit BEFORE buzzing them in.
- A friendly reminder that ALL VISITORS must <u>first</u> go to the office to be scanned in and get a visitor's pass).

- ~Thank you parents and guardians! With your help, we have <u>decreased</u> our <u>percentage</u> of <u>unexcused</u> absences AND <u>increased</u> our <u>percentage</u> of students in attendance. Keep up the great work ~ let's finish the year strong!!!
- **School Goal:** 95% or higher for regular attendance and low #s of UNEXCUSED Absences (below 20). We are also working to decrease the # of daily tardy students.





Help Your Child Succeed in Preschool and Kindergarten Build the Habit of Good Attendance

DID YOU KNOW...

Showing up on time every day is important to your child's success and learning from preschool forward.

Missing 10% of school (1 or 2 days every few weeks) can make it harder to:

- · Gain early reading and math skills.
- Build relationships.
- Develop good attendance habits.

High quality preschool and kindergarten has many benefits!

- The routines your child develops will continue throughout school.
- Make the most of early grades by encouraging your child to attend every day.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Work with your child and his/her teacher to develop your child's strong attendance.

Talk about it - sing about it - make it an adventure!

- Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Share ideas with other parents for getting to school on time.

Before the school year starts

- Find out what day school starts and begin a countdown!
- Keep your child healthy and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Attend orientation with your child to meet teachers and classmates and find out about health and safety procedures.

Ready, Set. GO!

- If you are concerned your child may have Covid-19, call your school for advice. Ask for resources to continue learning at home if needed.
- Ask family members or neighbors for assistance if you need help.
- Try to schedule non-Covid-19 medical appointments and extended trips when school is not in session.
- If your child seems anxious about preschool or kindergarten, talk to the program director, teacher, your doctor or other parents for advice.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

New legislation was approved changing the age at which children are eligible to begin Kindergarten.

The legislation requires all students entering Kindergarten be five years of age on or before September 1st.

It also includes a provision allowing parents to submit a written request for early enrollment if students do not meet the new requirement (provided that the child will turn five by December 31).

Branford Public Schools offers a full day Kindergarten experience at all three elementary schools for eligible 5 & 6 year-olds.

Registration opens Monday, February 5, 2024 and is ongoing.

Kindergarten Age Requirements:

A child must be five years of age on or before September 1, 2024.

To request early entry to Kindergarten or a second year of PreK for students turning five years of age between September 2, 2024 and December 31, 2024

If your child is currently enrolled in a Branford Public Schools PreK program and is eligible to enroll in Kindergarten, you DO NOT NEED to re-register your child. They are automatically rolled up to their next grade level.

Every eligible student registering for Kindergarten has a guaranteed space at the elementary school in your school district.

Kindergarten school hours follow elementary school hours: 8:55am to 3:25pm.

Kindergarten students take the bus with their fellow elementary school students.

The State of CT requires all students entering PreK and Kindergarten to have a completed and updated physical and immunization record within one year of the start of the first day of school. Please complete and submit pages 1, 2 & 4 of the Health Assessment Form (CT School Age).

Once Kindergarten students are assigned to a classroom, principals and/or teachers will communicate with individual families about plans for orientation.

Specific questions regarding your child should be directed to the principal at your child's elementary school.





Ramadan (Sun. Mar, 10-Tue. Apr. 9

We recognize and support our students at Murphy who will observing Ramadan (a time of fasting, reflection and community for Muslims).

Extra Set of Clothes

Please send a in a zip lock bag an extra set of clothes as mud puddles, and accidents happen.

Additionally, please be sure ALL students are properly dressed for the weather (as we do go out for recess and outdoor activities (weather permitting).

Lost and Found

If missing coats or personal belongings, please have your child check the Lost and Found (in the Main Front Lobby, as we have been displaying these items out front and center to help students locate their belongings.

Travel

If you plan to travel, with your child during a time when school is in session (not school breaks), please alert the Main office and the homeroom teacher to ensure attendance can be documented properly.

- What is the SBHC? Medical and mental health services available for enrolled students including physical exams, immunizations, sick child care and counseling services
- Who works in the SBHC? Staffed by licensed clinicians from Yale New Haven Hospital
- How much does it cost? There are no fees for SBHC services. Insurance will be billed with no copays; if uninsured, there will be no fee
- The SBHC does not replace your child's regular provider. We value the partnership with your child's provider and strive to coordinate care and follow up with them.
