


HAWK Cross Walk-Update

DRIVERS	
SEE THIS	DO THIS
	DRIVE Always look for people who plan to cross.
 FLASHING	SLOW DOWN A person has activated the push button.
	PREPARE TO STOP
	STOP for pedestrian. (As with any signal RED means STOP)
 FLASHING	STOP FIRST Proceed with caution if no people are present.
