



State Distribution of School-Level Overall SQSS Scores











SQSS Overall Indicator Score by Subgroup







Prescott Elementary Action Plan to Improve Achievement:

- Intervention Changes:
 - Alternating between 95% Group and Sonday (both programs are being utilized with all groups)
 - Pacing- moves students more quickly; spirals to ensure students continue to have exposure to skills they may not have mastered
 - Student groups are more flexible and not fixed for as long of a time period (students are aware of expectations for moving from group to group)
- **Students are further ahead in skills at this point in this year than they were last year.
- <u>State Reading Support Specialist Ashley Collins</u>
 - **✓** Coaching, supporting instruction, providing resources
- Paraprofessionals are in classrooms working with students more
- Continue to set monthly smart goals focused on essential standards and instruction focused on grade-level standards
 - Math-fluency on addition/subtraction and multiplication/division
 - Comprehension is focused on grade-level text
