Cooperation Lab at Boston College - Participation Opportunity



Cooperation Lab at Boston College Research Participation: Information for Parents

Dear Medfield Public Schools families,

My name is Sophie Riddick—I am a proud Medfield graduate (Class of 2018!) and am currently employed as a researcher in the Cooperation Lab at Boston College, a research group directed by Dr. Katie McAuliffe. I am part of a team of developmental psychologists interested in how social cognition and behavior develop in children. We're particularly interested in how cooperation develops in childhood.

With the permission and support of the Medfield Public Schools, we will be visiting **this fall.** Participating students between the **ages of 5 and 10** will have the opportunity to take part in a **10-15 minute study**.

If you give permission for your child to be in this study, your child will (1) be introduced to the task by a researcher, (2) be asked if they want to participate and, if they say yes, (3) participate in a task aimed at investigating how the means by which children acquire resources affects their willingness to share them. Specifically, children will obtain tokens either with or without themselves or their parents "working" for them (child "work" = drawing lines on paper; parent "work" = filling out forms). They will then choose how to distribute those tokens between themself and another child, and answer some questions about why they made their decision. At the end of the study, your child will get to trade their tokens for a prize (e.g., a small toy or art supply). We design the studies to be fun and engaging for children. These activities are most interesting for participants (and work best for us!) when children don't know what we're studying before they participate. So, if you would like to discuss the study goals with your child, we would be grateful if you could wait until after they have participated. When we finish working with the children at the Medfield Public Schools, we will put together and share a flyer that describes the study and shows some preliminary results in aggregate from all the children who participated.

All data collected as part of this research are **confidential** and data are anonymized prior to analysis and publication. We ask your permission to video record the testing session. Video recordings are stored in a secure server that is only accessible to trained members of our lab who have completed research ethics training. Video recordings are not required. If you'd like your child to participate but do not want videotaping to take place, simply mark "no" to the video question on the consent form. Please note that if you **do** consent to video recording, the camera would be set up behind your child and focused on the table so as not to capture their face. Our data and video handling and storage procedures have been approved by the Boston College Institutional Review Board which is part of the Office for Research Protections.


