GMAS TESTING DATES

- ELA Sections 1, 2, 3: April 23-April 25
- Math Sections 1 & 2: April 30 May 1





TESTING FORMAT

- All students in grades 3-5 will take the GMAS online.
- Students will receive all required testing accommodations (small group, read-aloud, extended time, etc...).
- GMAS is a timed test.

GMAS ACHIEVEMENT LEVELS

Level 1- Beginning Learners




ELA GROWTH




PROJECTED ELA PERFORMANCE
