

LEVEL 1 - BEGINNING LEARNER


- Does not yet demonstrate proficiency in the knowledge and skills at this grade level
- Will need substantial academic support to be prepared for the next grade level





LEVEL 2 - DEVELOPING LEARNER

- Demonstrates partial proficiency in the knowledge and skills necessary for this grade level
- Will need additional academic support to ensure success in the next grade level





LEVEL 3 - PROFICIENT LEARNER

 Demonstrates proficiency in the knowledge and skills necessary at this grade level

Is prepared for the next grade








LEVEL 4 - DISTINGUISHED LEARNER

- Demonstrates advanced proficiency in the knowledge and skills necessary at this grade level

WHAT ARE LEXILE SCORES?

Lexile levels are scores that match a student's reading ability with the difficulty of text material. It is interpreted as the level of book a student can read with 75% comprehension. This is the level that experts feel provides students with a certain level of comfort while still offering a challenge.

CLOSE READING

Close reading is a close interaction with the text that involves re-reading and reflecting in order to gain a deeper understanding of the text.


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WRITING

Students are being taught to:

- Write across the curriculum
- Read and then compare two texts, citing evidence found in the story
- Show how they got their answers in all subject areas
- Write answers that prove they understand what they read






STAMINA

- Reading stamina is a child's ability to focus and read independently for extended periods of time without giving up or getting too tired.
- No matter a test taker's age or command of general reading strategies, sitting, reading, thinking, rereading, and answering questions for several hours, several days in a row, is tough.
- If students can sit, read, reread, and think for long chunks of time, they will be better prepared to sit, read, reread, think, and answer questions when it is time to take a standardized test.






TEST TAKING TIPS

- remember the "vocabulary" of the
 - test that they have been taught.





WHAT CAN YOU DO AT HOME TO HELP?

- Read nightly and encourage your child to sit for 20 minutes reading silently to him or herself to build stamina.
- Practice math fluency and work on math packets each night.
- Practice typing on the computer.
- Help students review graded papers for understanding.
- Practice using educational websites.





