Parents Right to Inquire About Professional Qualifications	po2261.02	Parents have the right to request information from the District Administrator or designee about the professional qualifications of their students' classroom teachers and paraprofessionals including the following: • If the teacher has obtained the appropriate WI licensing for the grade level/subject areas of which the teacher is instructing. • If the teacher is teaching under an emergency or provisional license • If the teacher is teaching in the field of their certification • Whether the child is provided services by a paraprofessional, and the qualifications of that paraprofessional.

State Assessments/School Report Card	po2623	The District uses student assessments to provide timely information about student progress and ensure programming is meeting instructional goals. Annual state required assessments are as follows: Grades 4K-2: Early Literacy Screening will be given at the beginning, mid and end of year to monitor early literacy development. Parents will be notified by their child's classroom teacher regarding the schedule prior to the beginning of testing. Results will be shared with the parents at regularly scheduled conferences. Grades 3-8 Wisconsin Forward Exam, will be administered in the spring of each school year. Parents will be notified prior to the testing dates by their child's homeroom teacher. Students in all grades will be tested in Math, English/Language Arts, additionally, students in grades 4 and 8 will also complete assessments in Science and Social Studies. Parents will be mailed their child's results in the summer months (Usually late July or early August.) School Report Card: The annual school report card will be posted on the district website, as well mailed to each parent in the fall of each school year. Historically, the results have been published by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction in the month of November. The district will post/share these results within one week of their release from the WI DPI.
