





Current Realit

The Elementary (67.08) and High (62.44) Schools have an overall State performance score from the 2021-2022 school year.

Grade K-2 teachers will continue to administer the K-2 assessment previously given during the 2022-2023 school year.

Grade 3-12 teachers have been giving students a College and Career Reading Exam (ACT Aspire) and will be shifting to learn how to implement a new Arkansas State Criterion Based assessment.

DESE has provided a Playbook for ELA, Math, and Science content areas aligned to the new ATLAS assessment and Arkansas State Standards. Teachers are in need of learning which standards and what Depth of Knowledge are expected per grade level and content race during the implementation of the 2023-2024 units of instruction.

Standards are paced by guarter aligned to the previous year with the previous Essential Arkansas State Standards.



 For the 2021-2022 school year, commission from the drink machine was minimal. These proceeds were deposited into the high school activity account.

 - Considering assistance for school nurse
- Started off busy, but getting into a routine now
- Immunization Report for District Website

MIGRANT EDUCATION

- Successfully ran summer program for OSY with MOST participants in the state again this year. Funding increased to \$250,000.00
- Took program to farms and served more students
- Expenditures mostly tied to salaries
- Will be seeing materials and supplies



Allocations \$1,316,762.57 20% of the total \$1,316,762.57 ARP Fund 6795 = \$263,352.51

To Date we have spent only 12.45% of the required 20% Learning Loss set aside according to DESE.

We have a remaining \$78,867.18 to spend prior to September of 2024 to meet the required Learning Loss set aside.

 - Academic Facilities & Transportation, Masterplan, and facilities program with Scotty Holderfield for 2023-2024
- Title I, Part C Migrant TimeSheets, Applications, Budgets, and Assurances have been submitted to DESE for approval.
 - Ms. Selena Jurado is going through training to implement the Indistar reports to maintain this timeline for the Migrant Program as the Migrant Coordinator.
- One UAM Intern is working with HSD staff for the 2023-2024 School Year:
 - Natalie Huante K-6 building interning in the fall semester with Ms. Kirby Gibson & Ms. Kasey Johnston until December 2023 then again next semester with new staff
- One UAM student is observing classes for 2023-2024
 - Olivia Pierce K-6 building observing Coach Caruthers

Updates (2 of 2):

- We have until December of 2023 to spend the money approved within a DESE School Safety Grant. We have submitted a revised application to the Safety Unit/DESE Finance Unit for approval to revise the budget to meet the current needs / priorities of HSD for the current year.
- Office for Education Policy (OEP) at the University of Arkansas regarding Hermitage Freshman likelihood of success passing their courses from 2020-2021 & 2021-2022. They concluded:
 - Hermitage Freshman students are more likely to succeed by passing their courses than that of the state
 - Economically Disadvantaged Freshman would be more than likely to be Below Average than that of the State at Average.
