### **South Central Non-Teacher Grant Application**

#### **Guidelines:**

Grant projects are to be designed with the following guidelines in mind:

- The grant's purpose is to further enhance students' educational excellence with clearly articulated connections to the students.
- Expected student impact, whether that be on the expansion of a current program or based on a new program or idea.
- Creativity and innovation used to meet student needs
- Number of students involved and overall impact on the South Central community.

#### **Requirements:**

- All applications will be submitted to the Superintendent by grant deadline.
- Any non-teaching South Central School employee is eligible to apply for one grant per year.
- Additional information may be included that will allow the committee to understand the significance of the request.
- Applications cannot be duplicative of a prior year's grant application that was approved.

#### **Additional Information:**

- Serving a single grade-level or department up to \$500
- Serving a single building or multi-grade levels up to \$750
- Serving multiple departments or district-wide up to \$1,000

  The grant cannot be used to fund any food. Any equipment or materials purchased with grant monies become the property of South Central Local Schools.
- The grant selection committee is comprised of individuals who reside and/or work in the South Central Local School District
- GRANT DEADLINE: October 13, 2023
- Request to encumber funds must be submitted to the South Central Treasurer no later than December 4, 2023.
- All final expenditures must be completed by June 30, 2024.
