
Rey Budget Categories




LEVEL Curriculum

This year we are focusing on "Leveling Up" our curriculum and standards. What does that mean? Well, we are focusing on higher order thinking and critical thinking skills in the classroom. Instead of simply asking multiple choice type questions, we are looking to level up by asking students to apply the knowledge they are learning to different situations and contexts. At the lower grades we are focusing on the "Science of Reading" curriculum, which carries more focus on the importance of decoding and phonics. Research has been overwhelmingly in support of this initiative. The upper grades are leveling up and organizing their writing curriculum to help our students to express their thoughts in an organized and creative manner. We like to think of every student as having their own individual plan of education. We differentiate everything so that our students are accessing materials at the exact level that is right for them. It's time to "Level Up" at Alden-Hebron!

Reading Program

Reading is the single most important thing a parent can do with their child at home. So we decided to implement a reading program for our students. Each month, students will get a calendar with a different theme. Then, they are challenged to read each day for 20 minutes. If they meet the challenges, they will earn tokens to redeem for some cool prizes! We also have Stories with the Slocums on our Facebook page where Mr. Slocum reads and gives a shout out to each student who is watching!

Data

We are very proud to say that our data has improved in every category the last two years. We have improved our reading, math and science scores at each grade level. Our 5 essentials survey which is taken by our staff, students and parents showed impressive results, as we were rated as "strong" or "very strong" in every single category! Schools that score as "strong" in at least 3 of the 5 categories are said to be 10 times more likely to grow. Alden-Hebron Elementary School scored higher than that in all 5 categories!

We are very proud of our students for the growth they are showing socially and academically. We are also extremely proud of the climate and culture we have built here at the elementary school. It truly is a place where people want to work and feel valued and appreciated.

Some of these clubs will meet during lunch hours, while others will convene after school. As we approach the launch date, we will share more details about the specific meeting times, locations, and the dedicated sponsors for each club. Please note that the start dates for some clubs may be subject to factors such as the availability of equipment, sponsors, and the number of interested students.



For our Middle School students, we will have clubs dedicated to ART, Robotics, Chess, and 3D printing. High School students will have the opportunity to join clubs focused on ART, Robotics, 3D printing, and a Book club. We are fortunate to have the resources to staff these clubs adequately and provide the necessary equipment to ensure our students have the best possible experience. We're the proud recipients of the HydroConnect Grant, providing us with 19 classroom/tabletop gardens, 1 commercial garden, plus all supplies and curriculum for K-12 implementation. 


