

EAGLES SOAR OVER IRONMEN:

Winning the toss has not equated to winning the game in the past few weeks for the Ironmen as they dropped the game against the Claremore Sequoyah Eagles. The Eagles' run game proved unstoppable for the Ironmen's defense. Special teams were the only highlight of the game with two blocked extra points and Chelo and Michael Prince returning the ball each time for 10+ yards. Bear Savala had punts for 42 and 45 yards, which were all-season highs. The defense got their fingertips on several balls to set up crucial stops including one in the first quarter where Kaed Freeman deflected a pass that set up 4th down for Zach Long to get the tackle at the line of scrimmage. This turnover on downs was right on the 1-yard line. The offense scored twice in the 4th quarter after a rather silent game. Peyton had a 35-yard run at 9:04 in the 4th quarter. Then, Jose Wilson had a 46-yard run with 6 minutes left. The final score was 14-60.

IRONMEN LOSE IN FIRST SHUTOUT OF THE SEASON:

The Ironmen lost their first shutout against the Rejoice Christian Eagles. The first quarter was off to a decent start with the Eagles only scoring one touchdown. The Ironmen defense brought up several stops forcing Rejoice to punt, including a QB sack for Jerome Jackson and a tackle in the backfield by Nic Humphries. The Ironmen offense would be forced to punt nearly every drive. Only one interception was thrown this game midway through the 2nd quarter. The final score was 0-49.

Senior Night



The Ironmen Offense scored strongly on their first drive, something they have failed to do in the past three weeks. Between Keyshawn, Tyler, and Peyton, the 5 minute drive put them up 6-0. The defense would hold tight forcing some major stops to bring the Wildcats to a scoreless 1st quarter. They would come clawing back in the second quarter however, taking the lead 6-8 going into halftime.
