SUNNYSIDE ELEMENTARY

Updates and Changes to Previous Safety Plan - COVID 19

TRANSPORTATION

Daily Transportation is provided to all students. Students do not need a mask on the school bus. Masks are provided upon request.

- *Morning Routes*
 - Kindergarten - Second Grade Students are dropped off in the School Bus Circle
 - Third - Eighth Grade Students are dropped off in the school parking lot.
 - Drivers with double routes using the same bus sanitize in between
- *Kindergarten Dismissal*
 - Two Bus Routes
 - Single Pick Up Point (less than 10 minutes)
- *First - Eighth Grade Dismissal*
 - Three Bus Routes (4 on Early Dismissal Wednesday's)
 - Two Pick Up Points
 - First - Third Grade
 - Fourth - Eighth Grade

FOOD SERVICES

All students walk through the cafeteria line and receive their both breakfast (if they choose) and lunch.

- *Breakfast Seating*
 - Students are allowed and/or assigned seating.
- *Lunch Seating* (4 different serving times: TK/K, 1-3, 4-5, 6-8). All eating areas cleaned between periods

- Weather permitting, outdoor eating locations are used as much as possible.

PLAYGROUNDS

Students are assigned areas on the playground by grade level. Students may use equipment but are encouraged to sanitize their hands before and after and after recesses, to mitigate the risk of spreading germs.

- Kindergarten: Kindergarten Playground Complex
- First - Third: Big Toy Complex, Courts and Field
- Fourth and Fifth Grade: Courts and Field
- Sixth – Eighth: Junior High Outdoor Facility.

JUNIOR HIGH ROTATIONS

Junior High Students rotate through seven periods per day. All classes have assigned seating. Students are encouraged to use hand sanitizer when exiting a classroom and entering the next classroom.

RESTROOMS

Restrooms are assigned in the following manner:

- Kindergarten: In the building restroom. When outside they may use the main hallway restroom. If in the cafeteria they may use the cafeteria restroom.
- First - Second Grade: "Ballroom" - Primary Restroom
- Third - Fifth Grade: Cafeteria Restroom
- Sixth - Eighth Grade: Middle Hallway Restroom and Portable Restroom (during PE)
- Staff: Men/Women Restroom

WATER DISPENSERS

Water dispensers are located in each of the classrooms, and almost all other school buildings and offices. Students are provided with disposable cups. As of September 1, 2021, indoor/outdoor water fountains will be turned back on. The water system was tested by an outside agency and was approved for use on August 24, 2021.

ROOM CLEANING

All offices, classrooms and common buildings are cleaned daily. High touch areas are wiped down with a disinfectant.

SOCIAL DISTANCING

While in class students are encouraged to social distance. Teachers may conduct small groups but are encouraged to limit this to less than 15 minutes. When possible groups may work outside with support staff.

TESTING - VACCINATION

Sunnyside is no longer conducting onsite testing.

SCHOOL LIBRARY

UPDATE:

The school library will reopen beginning January 10, 2022.

OFF CAMPUS GROUPS

UPDATE:

Off campus groups may begin using indoor facilities beginning January 1, 2022. Groups must complete a Facilities Use Form, submit a COVID Plan, and complete the Facilities Use Form Addendum – COVID prior to approval.

GROUP TRACING

Sunnyside is no longer tracing close contacts. Anyone in the vicinity of a Positive COVID case receives a text message with link to notification letter.

Sample Notification: **Your child in Mrs. Hulse's class may have been exposed to a (+) COVID case. Contact would have been on the following date(s) Jan. 24. If your child was not at**

ISOLATION AND QUARENTINE PROTOCOLS

Sunnyside is following the protocol listed below for staff and students:

STUDENTS and STAFF

Students who are POSITIVE may return after 5 days if:

- They test negative on Day 5 – may return Day 6
- No fever present without Meds
- Symptoms have improved

If all three criteria are not met, they will sit out the 10 days with no reentry test required.

NOTE: Any Mandates and Orders issued by or through the California Department of Health Supersede any Local Guidelines and Mandates. Anything not addressed defaults to the previous plan.
