Our Sawtooth students are excited to see the production of Twas The Night Before Christmas tomorrow afternoon in the ACA. We actually have a number of Sawtooth students in the production, so we are looking forward to not only seeing a live theater performance but also seeing our own Sawtooth students perform as well!

Our 6th grade students had a visit from the Mayor of Grand Marais, Tracy Benson, last week. They were able to interview her and learn about her role in local government. The main purpose of this visit was to kick off the "Mayor for a Day" essay writing competition they are participating in. The contest is put on by the League of Minnesota Cities and the students who submit their essays are competing with other students across the state for \$100 and recognition in Minnesota Cities magazine. This experience also tied into their trip last week in which they were able to visit the State Capitol building in St. Paul. Our 6th graders reported to school at 4:30 am to get on the bus and ride to Saint Paul. Through their tour of the building and art, students were able to learn a lot about Minnesota history and culture. After their morning visit they headed across the river to Minneapolis to take in a live production of A Christmas Carol at the Guthrie Theatre. All of the experiences happening in 6th grade are great examples of collaboration and work across curriculum areas between the social studies and English classes.

This Friday we have a number of high school students participating in the first World Culture Day in Two Harbors. This is an event put on by the Two Harbors High School World Culture Club. Students will be able to attend sessions on a variety of topics discussing cultures that may be different from their own. These sessions will be led by speakers that include former Peace Corps volunteers to college faculty members and will even include sessions centered around travel and learning opportunities for teenagers.

Funding for both the 6th grade trip to the metro and the senior high trip to Two Harbors came from the Cook County School District 166 Education Foundation. We are very grateful and lucky to have support for such positive and authentic learning experiences.

Winter Weather Decisions from Superintendent Chris Lindholm:

As we flip calendars to the month of December, it's time to review how decisions about delaying or cancelling school due to the weather are made and communicated. When the forecast indicates that a storm is approaching, the Superintendent and the District Transportation Specialist closely monitor the information published by the National Weather Service in Duluth and communicate with them as needed to make the best decisions possible with the information that is available. While we always want to have school run normally if it's possible, we also must ensure the safety of students.

If a school delay or closure decision must be made in the morning, we will drive area roads starting at 4:00am and be in communication with the Cook County Highway Department. Cook County is a very large, geographically diverse area with significant differences in weather due to distance, elevation, and the Big Lake. The decision to delay or close school will be made between 5:00am and 5:30am to begin the communication process.

Decisions about weather cancellations will be communicated via the following: the district automated phone calling & email system, the district website (<u>cookcountyschools.org</u>), WTIP, WDIO, WCCO, KBJR6, KQDS, and Boreal. Please check these communication venues instead of calling the school as no one will be in the office to answer the phones.

In the event that the decision is to run an E-Learning Day (students learn from home) instead of a simple closure, the decision will be made the day before and communicated to families proactively. Devices and learning materials will be sent home with students the day before the E-Learning Day.

Parents always have the right/ability to keep students home for their safety when the weather makes travel dangerous. If you choose to keep your student(s) home -or if you choose to drive your student to school instead of having them ride the bus- please contact the school office in the morning so the bus driver can be notified proactively. Thank you to the many Cook County families that communicate so closely with the school office to help us keep our students safe and accounted for!!!













Facilities & Grounds Improvements Planning Update:

Thank you to the many community members, students, and staff members who participated in the October and November listening sessions regarding Cook County Schools facilities and grounds!! ICS has now completed and reported to the school board a demographics & enrollment projections study, a comprehensive facility study, an educational adequacy assessment, and a report on the input collected from both internal and external stakeholders. The school board will now consider the best options for addressing the identified needs and priorities and weigh options for moving forward.

ICS facilitated ten input sessions with a wide range of stakeholders and identified the needs and priorities that were repeated with frequency during those sessions. Those priorities include:

During the "educational adequacy" study, ICS evaluated every space in the schools for compliance with school district facilities and grounds guidelines published by the MN Department of Education. In the image below, areas shown in green are in compliance, areas shown in red and not in compliance, and areas shown in yellow are partially in compliance.

If the district decides to move forward with developing ideas and options to address the identified needs and priorities, more feedback opportunities will be scheduled in the early months of 2024. If it is necessary to ask the public to approve a bond referendum to address some or all of the identified priorities, the school board will need to make that decision by May to include it in the November, 2024 general election.



Mr. McHugh's 9th Grade English class spent their class time reading to elementary students.




