

I have traveled a lot for work the past few years. Although I have participated in a significant amount of formal education, I have learned more from when I travel than I have in any program in which I have participated. I believe I have learned everything I needed to know about life on an airplane. This newsletter is a unique take on experiences which helped reinforce my perspective on how we should live and act in today's world.

1. Do not recline your seat.

As I watched a young man recline his seat and hit the man behind him in the knees, I realized there was a lesson in this often normal (and accepted) behavior. I understood why the man reclined...self-satisfaction...being more (or somewhat) comfortable. It makes sense. However, we must look outside our own comfort if we are to truly do what is right by others. By not reclining, you are telling the person you respect them. You are willing to sacrifice (for a time) your satisfaction so they can have a 'little' more space. This should be who we strive to be in life. We must be willing to sacrifice our own comfort to positively impact others. It is when we impact others that we can live a fulfilled life.

2. Young children will cry on an airplane.

We see the crying child in the check-in line, and we are all thinking the same thing. Please do not let them sit by (or near) me. We roll our eyes when the child cries or will not sit still. We wonder why parents cannot 'control' their children. I will let you in on a secret. There is not a parent in the world who hopes their child will not behave appropriately on an airplane. There is not a parent in the world who is praying for an event free trip. How does this relate to us (if you do not have children or are the one parent whose children never melt down on a plane)? Simply put...we need to stop blaming others and control what we can control. We must empathize instead of criticize! Offer a helpful word or gesture because we know it will make a difference. We can choose not to blame; we can forgive, forget, and focus on helping.

3. A Message Matters but How the Message is Delivered Matters Most

We can script 'life' as much as we want, but effectiveness boils down to the person delivering the script. When James Earl Jones reads, I listen...not because of the content, but because of the sound. When George Costanza (Seinfeld reference to those too young to remember) reads, I doze off to sleep. On my trip to California, I listened to five flight attendants go through safety protocol. I cannot recall four of them. However, one of them stood out. The message was no different, but the delivery was unique. It was someone who was (or pretended well to be) excited about the content. They made the content seem real to me and I found myself paying close attention. At that moment, I realized something. We all have a message to share. However, the message will always be secondary to how the message is shared.

4. Say Thank You

Many years ago, my wife and I arrived in Minneapolis from a vacation. The bags which were checked planeside were arriving via a machine. There was a mass of people standing in front of it. My wife and I happened to be directly in front of all the bags. We looked at each other and said, 'let's get to work'. We started unloading the bags and handing them to people as they walked into the airport. I am not telling you this because we want to be recognized. I am telling you because of what did not happen. We finished handing out the bags (probably 35-40), grabbed our bags, and headed to our next gate. On the walk, my wife said something I would have never noticed. She said, "Did you notice not one person said thank you?" She was right. I do not think we were on a plane with only rude people. I was with a group of people who were tired from flying and wanted to get home. We go so fast in life that we often forget the power of a 'thank you'. We must make time to say thank you for what others do for us. When we do not do this, we lose an opportunity to make someone's day.

5. The person is more powerful than the process.

It is clear flight attendants have a process when they are on a flight. Personality makes a difference, but on one flight, I did not see personality (or lack thereof) from any of the flight attendants. I saw the process and it intrigued me. I realized it did not matter who the person was, but rather, the process the organization put into place. A strong process endures while a strong person...well...you never know. Great organizations are not about an individual, but rather about the collective responsibility of an organization to build its own capacity. It is the process and not the person that is key.

As I have gotten older, I realized the opportunity to learn is around us...at all times. We have to take advantage of those times. My challenge for you is to be mindful of what is happening around you. Observe...learn...and your next 'airplane' ride will become filled with learning and inspiration.




A Career and Technical Student Organization that functions as an integral part of the Family and Consumer Sciences education curriculum and operates within the school system.

Vision Screening

The North Dakota Lions SIGHT 4 KIDZ Project provides Free Vision Screening to ensure that "no child needs to suffer with an undetected vision disability." To date, approximately 20,000 children statewide have been screened and with a referral rate of 10% to 12% that means that 2,000 to 2,400 children who were living with an undetected vision disability have been referred to an eye care professional. Members from the Fargo Lions club and Lions clubs throughout the state use state-of-the-art technology (Plusoptix S12C Mobile Vision Screeners) to determine if children are experiencing vision issues. The Mobile Screener can measure many eye-health issues at the same time:

The Mobile Defection can incusate many eye nearth issues at the se

Anisometropia—compares refraction of both eyes.

- · Astigmatism—checks corneal curvature
- Myopia—checks nearsightedness

The more than 46,000 Lions clubs and 1.4 million Lions throughout the world are "focused on service". Two of the Fargo Lions club's major focuses are on vision issues and service to youth. Lions of North Dakota have long served people's vision needs by providing programs such as: recycling glasses and assisting with the purchase of glasses for the needy, video magnifiers for the aged, and in 2014 the Lions across North Dakota launched the SIGHT 4 KIDZ program for the children. The programs designed to detect vision disabilities at an early age when vision issues are the most treatable.

The Fargo Lions with the assistance of our PTO volunteers will conduct our vision screening on Monday, November 20th for Preschool through 6th grade students. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Nurse Allison. The process is quick with no discomfort to the child.
