Families,

I was recently in Miami with the newest semi-finalists for the Yass Prize. It was invigorating to be around people who were choosing greatness in order to benefit others. During my time with the Yass Prize family, I participated on a panel related to leadership non-negotiables. One of the panelists summarized this idea quite simply. He said, “Everything about greatness is directly related to attitude.” I have worked at becoming more aware of surrounding myself with others who have a great attitude. I’m making a conscious effort to choose positivity. Simply put, it makes me feel better. I feel better mentally and physically when I’m surrounded by those who see the good things in life. My dad values seeing those things and I’m going to commit to be more like him by choosing positivity.

There was a time when I played high school basketball (not well...but I played). I went from starting early my sophomore year to the bench near the end of the season. After a game where I played very little, I expressed my ‘disappointment’ to my dad. I expected him to empathize with me but that was not what I got. He said, “You earn what you get. If you are not getting what you want, you have not earned it. There is nothing owed to you. At some point this year, you made a choice (conscious or not) which has led to this moment. Reflect on this and make a new choice!” Little did I realize that moment has remained with me to this day. My dad loved me and he showed it in this moment. He was right. I did make a choice and the consequences of not playing were appropriate. The next morning, I talked to my coach not to express my disappointment but rather to ask what I could do differently to help the team (and not me). My dad believed we must be accountable for the decisions we make. It is not always easy, but it is always right.

My dad is truly one of the great men I know. He does what he says. He loves his family unconditionally and has committed to living a life of service to others. I’m blessed to have him still in my life and I’m going to make sure he knows that. During this holiday season, please take a few moments to thank the ‘Ken Steiner’ in your life for their impact. We all have a ‘Ken Steiner’ in our life and they deserve to know how much they mean to us.

Winter Event Attendance Behavior

Basketball and concert season has arrived at our school. We appreciate your family's support of curricular events. We also ask for your help in teaching/reinforcing how to be an attendee at an event. If you plan to attend a home or away event, please explain the following expectations to your children:

1. Sit and watch the performance or game.
 1. Learners should not be running through the building, hanging out in the learning center areas, or wandering hallways.
2. For concerts, please do not enter the gymnasium while a song is being performed and try not to leave during a song as it disrupts the performance.
3. Cheer for the performers or team. Booing at sporting events is never appropriate. Please remember it is always a 'kid' simply playing a game. Please also remember referees may get paid, but they are truly volunteers which allows our learners to play these games.
4. Clean up after yourself and at the conclusion of the event.
 1. Throw away empty containers or programs; do not leave them in the bleachers or seating areas.

Learners not complying with expectations will be returned to their parents and expected to sit next to them for the remainder of the game/event. If problems persist, learners may not be allowed to attend future events.



NDHSAA BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS

FOR REGULAR AND POSTSEASON COMPETITIONS:

- Respect the American flag and the National Anthem.
- Contesting schools shall each have an authorized faculty representative present who shall be responsible for his/her school's participants, students, and fans throughout the contest.
- Spectators must wear appropriate clothing. Those who do not comply or who wear clothing that is vulgar, obscene or that in some other way inappropriate, as determined by school/tournament personnel, will be removed from the facility if they do not cooperate with this behavior expectation.
- The use of appropriate language is expected at all times. Profanity, negative chants, trash talk, name-calling, personal attacks or other acts of disrespect are unacceptable and must be immediately addressed by school/tournament administrators. Any discriminatory slur will result in immediate removal from the facility.
- Any attendee ejected from a NDHSAA tournament venue will be banned from the venue(s) for the remainder of the event.
- Respect the game/contest. Under no condition shall anyone other than the members of the official squad enter the playing surface. No one may interfere with the contest in any way.
- Handheld signs and flags, which do not obstruct the view of others, are permitted provided they are in good taste. Signs or other similar items contest/tournament officials deem to be in poor taste will be removed. Message or "white" boards are prohibited. The carrying of flags around the playing surface is NOT allowed.
- Artificial noisemakers of any kind (i.e. megaphones, cowbells, sirens, whistles, thunder sticks, and other similar items) are not allowed at any indoor events, including outdoor sports played at indoor venues. Exception – Megaphones appropriately used by cheerleaders are permitted if allowed by contest officials.
- Laser lights or any other lights deemed distracting to participants are strictly prohibited.
- The use of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAV), also known as drones, is prohibited at all contests.

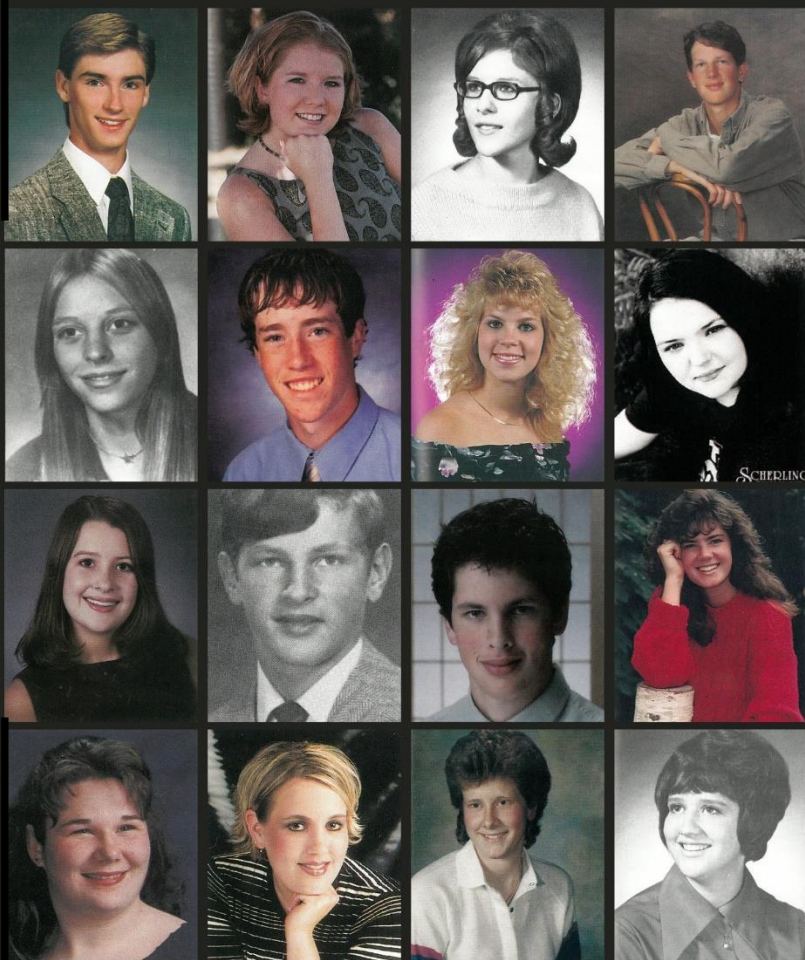
