  - 31 learners in 2023-24






## **ENROLLMENT**

- Birth certificate required
- Immunizations required
  - Not COVID
- Limited to 28 learners
  - 14/section
  - May allow additional learners due to extenuating circumstances

- Open Enrollment Applications due on February 29, 2024, for families that do not live in District (will do twice)

#### **TUITION**

#### • \$35/day

- 5 days/week for the entire 2024-25 school year
  - \$5,880/year (based on 168 days of contact time)
  - Will be billed out in 8 monthly installments starting in September 2024
  - Note: If your child has qualified for special education services, contact Dr. Steiner for further information

#### Payments must be received for the month in advance

 PLEASE notify Dr. Steiner if your payment will be late or you need assistance





#### BEST IN CLASS GRANT

- Northern Cass received \$240,000 in 2023-2024
- Program is provided through ND Dept of Health & Human Services
  - Monthly tuition amount is based on household income with a sliding scale
  - Provides opportunity for family engagement activities
  - Health, Dental, Vision, and Development screenings held on site
- Communication with families will occur in June 2024 on how the district will utilize the funding.



#### PRE-K SPRING SCREENINGS

- Screenings will take place at Northern Cass School on April 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> (they are required)
  - Screened in the following areas: pre-academics, fine motor, gross motor, cognitive, language development
    - Screening results guide educators in determining if your child is ready for the academic, play-filled, and structured environment of the Northern Cass Preschool program
    - If your child scores significantly low and shows red flags, you will be required to wait for the following school year
- If your child has a late spring summer birthday (end of April-July) and they have time to wait before starting, it is in their best interest to wait.
  - As a parent, if you are questioning if your child should attend or not, give them the gift of waiting.



#### TOP SKILLS TO PREPARE FOR SCHOOL

- 1. Help your child begin to practice writing their name confidence booster!
- 2. Allow your child to build independence in self help skills: zipping, shoes, dressing in snow gear, completely independent in the bathroom.
- 3. Practice opening snack/food items, using table manners, cutting basic foods with forks, using silver wear, cleaning up messes.
- 4. Talk about ways to be responsible for yourself and your things cleaning up spaces, controlling your body, packing backpacks, etc.
- 5. Practice using school supplies at home safe cutting with a scissors, gluing with glue sticks/bottles, closing markers when finished.

- 1. Create a reading routine at your house this helps build a love of reading and prepare for reading and sitting in a large group setting at school!
- 2. Practice naming/identifying emotions (in the moment) and safe/healthy ways to express emotions around others.
- 3. Play games that require turn taking. Allow your child opportunities to win and lose.
- 4. Allow your child to explore letters, letter sounds, and numbers.
- 5. Know that your child will be loved and cared for in every moment of their school experience.

# SCHOOL DAY

• Follows the regular school calendar (school day starts at 8:30 a.m. and concludes at 3:30 p.m.)





## TRANSPORTATION

- Busing provided for learners by the school
  - Pre-determined bus routes and schedule mailed prior to start of school
- Busing is a privilege and not a right





## BREAKFAST/LUNCH/SNACKS

- Breakfast, lunch, and snack are provided by the school and paid for by each family
  - Learners may bring a lunch from home
  - Current Prices (this will most likely go up next year)
    - Breakfast is \$2.00/meal (free if you qualify for free or reduced)
    - Lunch is \$3.40/meal (\$.40 if you qualify for free or reduced)
    - Milk/snack is \$1.00/day (no reduction for free and reduced)
    - Extra milk is \$0.50 (no reduction for free and reduced)
    - Note: You are only charged for days your learner eats school breakfast or lunch.

- If you want to visit your child's classroom, please provide the educator with 24-hour notice; **PLEASE VISIT**



- 1. Identify & describe title, author, and illustrator of a book
- 2. Identify and name uppercase and lowercase letters
- 3. Identify the amount of syllables in given words
- 4. Identify the beginning sounds in given words
- 5. Identify and produce rhyming words
- 6. Identify and produce sounds of uppercase/lowercase letters in isolation
- 7. Identify and write beginning sounds to represent words in sentences
- 8. Recite numbers in the correct order up to 20
- 9. Identify and name numbers from 0 to 20
- 10. Give one number word to each counted object from 1 to 10
- Name the number of items in a set without counting each object up to 5 (subitizing)
- 12. Compare groups of objects up to 10
- 13. Use objects to solve simple addition problems within 5
- 14. Use objects to solve simple subtraction problems within 5
- 15. Recognize and duplicate simple patterns
- 16. Order objects by size and length
- 17. Identify common two-dimensional shapes
