Each PCHS students will develop an individualized learning plan to help make decisions about career and post-secondary education or training, to plan a course of study, and to make financial aid assessments with family members.

#### By the end of 9th Grade

#### Student should be supported to:

- Complete a career cluster survey
- Complete a career interest survey
- Attend a PS options workshop
- Select course work for PS/career plans aligned with the ISBE College and Career Readiness Indicators
- Begin to determining eligibility for dual credit courses
- Outline a plan for community service and extracurricular activities related to PS plans
- Attend a basic financial aid presentation with a trusted adult

#### A student should know:

- One or two career clusters for further exploration
- The relationship between HS coursework, attendance, and grades to PS plans
- Importance of community service and extracurricular activities to PS and career plans
- General cost ranges of various PS options

- Complete the "Career Interest Profiler" in Naviance
- Career Buffet
- Meet individually with each student for course registration & career planning. Student will complete CCRI worksheet
- Review course pathways & develop 4-year

- Students will create a SMART goal related to community service and or extracurricular activities
- Evening paying for college presentation **Action Items:**
- Students will "favorite" one or two career clusters after completing their "Career Cluster Finder"
- Completion of Naviance Curriculum throughout 9th grade year
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## Students should be supported to:

 Visit at least one workplace to aligned to career interests

By the end of 10th Grade

- Participate in activities related to thier career cluster of interest
- Select a career area of interest: enroll in career pathway (CP) as available
- Explore opportunities along the Work Based Learning Continuum
- Connect and build relationships with 2-3 adults to support the PS and career selection process
- Review coursework, and PS/career plans in relation to the ISBE College and Career Readiness Indicators (every year)
- Attend a basic financial aid presentation with a family member

#### A student should know:

 Educational requirements, cost, expected entry level, and midpoint salary for occupations in select CP

Skills related to career interests

- Different types of PS credentials and institutions
- General timing of PS entrance exams and apps
- Benefit of early college credit opportunities to PS access and completion

#### Action Items:

- Support student to set up a job shadowing experience
- Support students to join career related clubs/organizations
- "Favorite" a career pathway in Naviance & register for classes in pathway as available
- Support students to identify opprotunities for Work Based Learning
- Students will identify adults to support them in PS planning
- Meet individually with each student for course registration & career planning. Student will complete CCRI worksheet & Review/update 4-year plans
- Evening Paying for college presentation

#### By the end of 11th Grade

#### Student should be supported to:

- Revisit the career interest survey
- Participated in mock job interview
- Create a resume and personal statement
- Complete an experience within the Work Based Learning Continuum
- Determine readiness for college-level coursework math/ELA and enrolled in either "catch-up" or "speed up" course.
- Complete or enroll in at least one early college credit opportunity
- Attend a college fair
- Visit at least 3 PS institutions
- Take at least one college entrance exam
- Complete a Postsecondary Plan Workshop

#### A student should know:

- App deadlines, test timing, cost, and prep for industry based certification for CP
- Entrance requirements, including app deadlines, for expected PS program of study
- 3-5 match schools, one safety, and one reach school for PS program of study

- Address any remedial needs in math/ELA
- Complete a financial aid offer workshop

#### A student should know:

- How CP courses and experiences articulate to degree programs at PS options
- Estimated cost of each PS options
- Affordability of PS options in relation to expected entry-level career salary and anticipated debt
- Terms and conditions of any scholarship or loan

## By 12/31 of 12th grade a student should have:

- Completed 3 or more admission applications to PS institutions
- Ensure all steps in the PS admissions process are completed on time
- Attend a Financial Aid Application completion workshop
- Complete a financial aid application

- Enroll in CNA or other course to earn certification
