As you are aware, you are allowed two college days for the school year.

If you can make a campus visit, make sure that you:

- Talk to an admissions counselor and financial aid administrator.
- Visit with students for insider viewpoints.
- Sit in a class and spend the night in a dorm, if possible.
- Write down your general impressions.

Be sure to ask the following questions:

- What is the average class size?
- Is off-campus student housing an option?
- How safe is the campus?
- What extracurricular activities does the school offer?
- Can I have a car on campus? Is parking available?
- Will I have computer access?
- What types of academic support services are available?
- Are freshman classes taught by professors or graduate students?

College Information

<u>MeritAid.com</u> – MeritAid.com is the first comprehensive Web site dedicated to helping students with the college search by matching them to merit-based scholarships from colleges across the country. Check out this web site and let MeritAid.com show you the money.

Free College for Children of Texas Veterans

If your parent was living in Texas when they joined the military, you may be eligible to get a free college education at a Texas public university. A recent change to the Hazlewood Act provides the option for veterans to pass their Hazlewood benefits to their children. To see if you are eligible, go to www.tvc.state.tx.us/Hazlewood.html.

Frost National Bank – The Abe and Annie Seibel Foundation is a zero-interest educational loan program available through Frost National Bank in Galveston, TX. Qualified applicants must: be US Citizens and Texas Residents, graduate from a Texas high school, enroll full-time at a Texas college or university, working toward a degree. Graduating high school seniors entering as college freshmen are reviewed by high school class rank in relation to SAT/ACT scores. Eligible students must be either in the top 10% of their high school graduating class OR have a minimum 1100 SAT or 23 ACT score.

There are approximately 800 loans available per year with a maximum loan of \$8,000 per year. The application deadline is February 28th. For more information, please contact 409-770-5665. More information is available at www.everychanceeverytexan.org. You can contact the office after November 1st to obtain an application.

<u>Texas State University</u> – Texas State offers \$10,000 a year for four years to students who qualify as National Merit Finalists and \$2,000 a year for up to four years for students selected as National Achievement Finalists or National Hispanic Scholars. The President's Honor and Texas State Achievement Scholarships are also available.

<u>Angelo State University</u> – Angelo State has several programs available to help students pay for their college:

➤ Blue and Gold Guarantee: Provides full tuition and mandatory fees for freshmen coming from Texas families with a gross income of \$70,000 or less.

Rice University – Admission decisions are need blind and we meet 100% of need eligibility:

For families whose income is \$75,000 or less, Rice will meet 100% of need eligibility covering full tuition, fees, room, and board.


For families whose income is above \$75,000 and less than \$140,000 who demonstrate need eligibility, we will cover full tuition.

<u>University of Houston</u> The Cougar Promise guarantees tuition and mandatory fees will be covered by grant assistance for new Cougars who meet the requirements:

Be a Texas Resident for tuition purposes, complete the FAFSA by the UH priority deadline, be eligible to receive a Federal Pell Grant, Graduate from a Texas high school, be a dependent member of a household whose adjusted gross income does not exceed \$65,000, and enroll as a full-time student. Tuition support will be given for students with family incomes which fall between \$65,001 and \$125,000. For more information, visit uh.edu/cougarpromise.

Make the U Scholarship Program

The purpose of this scholarship is to encourage young Hispanics to "Make the U" and get them on the path to higher education. A total of 100 \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded. Students should log on www.colgate.com/en-us/make-the-u and follow the application process to submit the application. Application deadline is November 13th.

\$\$ C. Jackson Grayson Scholarship

Scholarships are awarded to Houston area seniors. Recipients will receive \$25,000 each school year. Scholarship applications are available at http://learnmore.scholarsapply.org/apqc/. Deadline to apply is November 30th. The first 100 applications will be presented to the committee for review.

\$\$ Hagan Scholarship Foundation

The Hagan Scholarship is a four-year need-based merit scholarship providing recipients with the opportunity to graduate college debt-free. Student must attend a public high school, have achieved a 3.5 GPA, enroll in an eligible college or university, must work 240 hours between January 1st and when college will begin, and must have an adjusted household income not to exceed \$85,000. Applications are available at www.hsfmo.org. Flyers are available in the Counselor's Office. **Deadline to apply is December 1st**.

\$\$ Horatio Alger Association Scholarship Program

This scholarship program provides financial assistance to students throughout the nation who have financial need and have exhibited integrity and perseverance in overcoming personal adversity. Scholarship criteria also includes high school graduation in the spring of 2024, commitment to pursue a bachelor's degree, have at least a 2.0 GPA, and United States citizenship. Applications are available at scholars.horatioalger.org. Deadline depends on the type of scholarship applying for. There are several types of scholarships available.

SPJST Scholarships

SPJST awards a state-wide scholarship for applicants that hold an insurance policy for at least one year and are a senior in high school. Applications are available at www.spjst.org. Deadline for applying is February 1st.

Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Foundation

This foundation offers scholarships to students pursuing a degree in agriculture or an agriculture-related program. Applicants must be graduating seniors accepted to a program in Texas or Oklahoma. Applicants are selected on the basis of their interest in the industry, leadership, academic achievement and financial need. Applications are available at www.cattleraisersmuseum.org/scholarships-awarded. **Application deadline is February 2nd.**

George and Mary Josephine Hamman Foundation

Seventy \$20,000 scholarships based on financial need and academic achievement will be awarded. The Application must be received by February 16th.
