Ruth E. Dannenberg, in Memory of Norman Koelliker, Scholarship

Ruth E. Koelliker Dannenberg was born near Robinson, Kansas and lived on the family farm with her parents Charles & Edna Koelliker and younger brother Norman Charles. Ruth attended Hiawatha High School and graduated as class valedictorian in 1927. She married Merrill Dannenberg in 1931 and lived near Robinson until moving to Hiawatha with her daughter Ruth Anna following her husband's death in 1949. She owned several farms in Brown County and treasured her agricultural background. To encourage graduates of Hiawatha High School to pursue degrees in agricultural related fields, Ruth established a scholarship to Kansas State University in memory of her brother, Norman, who died in 1935. Ruth passed away on March 17, 1993. The first scholarship was awarded in May of 1993.

This is a \$1,000 one-time nonrenewable scholarship.

The Hiawatha USD 415 Educational Foundation scholarship committee is responsible for selecting the scholarship recipient. The committee is authorized to establish eligibility criteria for the scholarship and criteria may be amended periodically as determined and recommended by the committee. Selection Criteria

- Recipient must be a graduate of Hiawatha High School.
- Recipient must have a high school grade point average of no less than 3.2.
- Recipient must have a financial need.
- Recipient must enter Kansas State University for their freshman year and intend to pursue a degree in an agricultural related field.
- Recipient must demonstrate potential success in post high school training. Information used in this
 area will include grade point average, class rank, ACT and/or SAT scores.
- Recipient must be enrolled as a full-time student (minimum of 12 credit hours) at Kansas State University.
- Participation in extracurricular activities and community involvement will be considered.
- By graduation, applicant must have completed at least eight units of academic credit from Hiawatha High School.

Application Process

All applicants must submit a completed application and required documentation as follows:

- Include a high school transcript, signed by the HHS counselor.
- Submit the application by April $1^{\underline{s}}$ to the counselor at Hiawatha High School.

Payment Procedure

The total amount of the scholarship award will be paid as one installment directly to Kansas State University for credit toward the recipient's tuition and expenses. Student must provide proof of enrollment by emailing a class schedule, including name of the school, to edfoundation@usd415.org by August 1st.
