Class of 2023 Graduation requirements:

- Four years of language arts.
- Three years of mathematics
- Two years of science (one life science, one physical science).
- Two years of social studies (American History and Government required)
State/Federal Constitution exams and civics requirement are satisfied by Government class
- One year chosen from (A) music, (B) art, (C) foreign language, or (D) vocational education.
- One semester of health education.
- Daily physical education classes.
- One semester of consumer education
- Participation in the SAT administration
- Submission of the FAFSA
- Total of 22 credits is required to graduate

Courses are offered in the following areas:

Agriculture, Computer Information, Family and Consumer Science, English, Mathematics, Music, Physical Education, Science, Social Studies, and Spanish

The following are considered advanced, honors classes and are weighted with an extra grade point:

English IV College Prep, English III College Prep, Algebra III, Pre-Calculus, Advanced Chemistry, Physics

- An average graduating class is approximately 50 students.
- 70% matriculate to community colleges
- 20% matriculate to 4-year colleges/universities
